

BUILDING A GIFTS-BASED CHURCH

*“For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is in you..”
~ (II Timothy 1:6)*

I believe that God is calling us to build a gifts-based church. By the power of God’s Spirit, I am convinced that we are being formed into a gifted community.

Paul, in his letter to Timothy, exhorts and reminds us to rekindle the gift of God. In the Epistle to the Corinthians, Paul teaches about the gifts of the Spirit – how there are many gifts but one Spirit. In Ephesians 2:8 Paul teaches that, *“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.”* The primary gift of God is *Grace*. Grace is God doing for us what we can not do for ourselves. By Grace God sent the Son, Jesus the Christ, to save us from Sin and death in order that we might live – and live abundantly in this world and eternally in the world to come. God’s gift to us was his Son, and in Jesus we continually receive the gift of new life by the power of Christ’s Spirit through faith.

Paul also says that it is by grace you have been saved through *faith*. Our response to the gift of God is faith. Faith is the appropriate response – our thank you – to the Grace of God which saves us. But what is this faith? Is it simply a mind believing? By no means! Jesus says, *“If you love me, you will keep my commandments.”* Apparently Jesus believes that to be his disciples we actually must be *doing* something. That is why the apostle James writes and teaches in James chapter 2 that *“Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith,”* or that *“Faith that is not accompanied by action is dead.”* [Read James 2:14-26].

Our faith must be an *active* faith. The world can not know the grace of God if the world does not see that grace of God at work in us through faith. Our faith must be a *living* faith. We must live our lives *trusting* that God is making all things new. And because we are the Church, the body of Jesus Christ himself, then we are his hands and feet and voice in this world. For this reason Jesus gives us his Spirit to lead us.

Now, we know that the Spirit endows in us gifts to be in ministry and mission in the world, as Jesus was in ministry and mission in the world. For this reason, I believe that God is yearning to build a Gift-based Church in us. God is longing to form us into a *gifted*-community that will be in active ministry and mission. Imagine what this church and community would look like if more us claimed the gifts that God has given us to use in ministry and mission! You are the church. I am the church. We are the church together. My prayer is that we join together in *One* Spirit, and rekindle the gift of God in us, that the world may truly know that God’s saving power is indeed active and alive here with us and through us! Amen.

The cost is \$25.00 and your check will be made payable to: VNA Care Network. Cash will be accepted BUT please bring exact amount as I may not be able to give you change.

Those adults over 65 years of age will not be charged the fee BUT must have their Medicare card and if they have another form of Health Insurance Card like: Fallon Senior, Tufts Health Plan Medicare Preferred HMO, BCBS Medicare HMO Blue, BCBS Medicare PPO Blue, GIC Unicare State Indemnity Plan, or HNE Medicare Advantage, with them. You will need to fill out the permission slip and not be sick with a temperature. You will also complete the reverse side of the form with your health insurance number and Medicare number so that the VNA business office can bill the appropriate insurance company for reimbursement. Mass Health does not participate with the VNA Care Network program.

IN CONTEXT

Gospel Lectionary selection for October 23, 2011 (Matthew 22:34-46)

In the first century, honor was considered a limited commodity (one's gain of honor meant another's loss). So there would occur "challenge-riposte" public games of competition for honor, played among social equals. The challenge was almost any word, gesture, or action that might undermine the honor of another, and a successful riposte would answer in equal measure and up the ante (return the challenge). Both positive challenges (compliments) and negative challenges (insults) would have to be answered to avoid a serious loss of face.

+++++

The lectionary selection takes place in the temple at Jerusalem, with Jesus speaking to the chief priests and the elders of the people (21:23), the Pharisees, Herodians, and Sadducees (21:45, 22:16, 23). In 22:35-36, one of the Pharisees challenged Jesus with a form of the third question asked at a Passover meal (concerning general moral principles, and traditionally asked by the third "perfect or well-rounded" son), "What is the great commandment in the law?" In 22:37-40, Jesus' quick response (directly from Deut 6:5 and Lev 19:18b) evidenced considerable skill at riposte, thereby revealing himself to those gathered to be an honorable and authoritative prophet.

In 22:41-46, Jesus moved on to a proper counter-challenge. Following the Pharisees' lead, Jesus asked a form of the fourth question at a Passover meal (concerning Torah-based doctrine, and traditionally asked by the fourth child – who is not old enough to ask questions, and thus is put by the father presiding at the Passover meal). Jesus' counter-challenge asks about the identity of the Messiah. The Pharisees' answer, "the Son of David" (actually a common title for Jesus in Matthew) brings Jesus' riposte that the Messiah must then be greater than David because David called him Lord (Ps 110:1). Jesus thus reduces his opponents to silence and is no longer directly challenged.

DID YOU KNOW?

The reading of scripture is central to our worship each week. Most commonly we hear the text read as translated in the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible, which is the translation of the pew Bibles.

Over the course of time hundreds of English translations of the Bible have been created, but one of the most influential is the King James Version. Did you know that this year is the 400th anniversary of the King James Bible, and that the NRSV traces its lineage to this version of the Bible? As summarized by the committee of translators for the NRSV: "the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible is an authorized revision of the Revised Standard Version, published in 1952, which was a revision of the American Standard Version, published in 1901, which, in turn, embodied earlier revisions of the King James Version, published in 1611." Known in the United States as the King James Version as it was commissioned by King James I of England, it is most commonly known as the "Authorized Version" in England. The KJV was the work of 47 Biblical scholars who worked from original Hebrew and Greek texts but who were also influenced by other existing English translations.

Over the course of time discovery of older ancient Biblical manuscripts as well as changes in the English language in general have been the impetus for updated translations. Nevertheless the linguistic impact of the KJV persists today, as many of our common phrases of our everyday language derive from the language of the KJV.
