Questions for Reflection -

What disappointments are you presently carrying in your heart? What would it mean for you to talk to Jesus about those disappointments? Through what life questions are you living right now? As you wrestle with these questions what is the spiritual sustenance you need?
- What have been some of your most meaningful experiences of the sacrament of Holy Communion? How does receiving Communion deepen your relationship with Jesus? How does it impact your relationship with other members of the congregation? What role does general table fellowship play in your spiritual journey? What is the importance of hospitality and welcome of strangers in the life of a congregation?
