Questions for Reflection —

- Overall do you find it easy or difficult to perceive God's presence in your life? Why is that? What distracts you or challenges your ability to perceive God's presence and action? What will help you be more attentive to and aware of God's everyday workings in the world?
- Have you ever felt discouraged or disillusioned as you seek to live into God's call for your life? What self-doubts, insecurities, and/or fears have you had to face in answering God's call for you? What sustains you in times of doubt and difficulty? What spiritual practices help you to reorient/refocus when you lose sight of God's purpose?
- What is your general approach to decision making? What role does listening for God's still small voice play when you face a significant decision? What enables you to best hear that voice? How might taking time for silence help you better connect with God? How can our congregation as community of faith be more attentive to God's still small voice as we discern God's call for our future?
