- What do you celebrate most about the diversity in our congregation? How has interacting with people of different backgrounds and cultural expressions deepened your faith journey? What meaningful practices, traditions, or rituals have you experienced as a result of being in relationship with people whose backgrounds are different from yours? What are the implications for our common life together of being open to and accepting of the practices and customs of others?
