- What does it mean to you personally to be a good steward of God's gift of nature? As a tenant of God's created world, what do you see as your part in care of the environment? What is the gap between how you would like to be a steward of creation and your present lifestyle? Is there something more than what you are presently doing to steward creation that you could or should do? What do you think creation care and environmental justice look like for a community of faith?
