Baptism Renewal and Holy Communion

(The following liturgy is written by Rev. Mary Johnson for today's worship service.)

Introduction:

Leader: Followers of Christ:

When we were baptized

we were made members of Christ's church.

We received access to the dynamic grace found within Christian community; whose

benefits of salvation have been freely shared with all.

Today, as we celebrate the baptism of our Lord,

we celebrate our own and the unity we share together.

Renunciation of sin and profession of faith:

Leader: I ask you once again before God and this company:

Are you rooting out the spiritual forces of wickedness from your life,

turning away from the temptation to use power for evil

and turning from your worldly ways?

Unison: I am.

Leader: Are you embracing the freedom and the power of the Holy Spirit

given to resist evil, injustice, bullying and every abusive privilege

in all their ever changing forms?

Unison: I am.

Leader: Are you being transformed by the saving grace of Jesus Christ by

being perfected in love, so you can serve the Lord who is manifest in people of every age,

nation and ethnicity?

Unison: I am.

Leader: Using all the gifts and graces given to you by the Holy Spirit,

are you living as a faithful member of Christ's holy church,

and as an ambassador for Christ in the world?

Unison: I am.

Leader: Let us join together and state clearly our Christian faith that we have found in our study of

Scripture, our tradition, our experience and our reason:

God in the Spirit revealed in Jesus Christ, calls us by grace

Unison: to be renewed in the image of our Creator,

that we might be one

in divine love for the world.

Leader: Today is the day

bless the world with mercy in its completion.

Great Thanksgiving:

Leader: We are water washed.

Unison: We are spirit born.

Leader: We are a chosen people,

Unison: Chosen to spread love, mercy, and compassion.

Leader: Our lives are filled with dancing joy

Unison: Our lips overflow with constant hallelujahs!

Leader: We are so thankful for Your acceptance.

You have immersed us in living water cleansing us from all our unrighteousness.

With the fire of Your Holy Spirit

You have inspired lives of love, joy, peace and patience.

Through baptism we have become one with the whole Christian family on earth and

with all of those in heaven. As one we proclaim:

Unison: We must walk worthy,

With lives of humility, Gentle and patient.

Loving each other, maintaining the unity. In a bond of peace. There is one body.
We've one hope of our calling.
There is one Spirit.

One Lord and one faith,
One baptism and one God,

Leader: Jesus shared in Your one baptism

in the Jordan River,

We remember that You were so pleased.

Jesus saw greatness in service.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
