Invitation to the Observance of the Lenten Discipline

Pastor: Dear Friend in Christ, every year we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Congregation: We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marks the repentance of this community.

Pastor: I invite you, in the name of Christ, to observe a Holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; by works of love; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

Congregation: To make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, we now bow before our Creator and Redeemer.
