What would it mean for you to engage your faith with various difficult economic, political, at social realities in the secular world?
- When/how have you known and experienced the peace of Christ breathed into you? In what aspects of your life is there presently a lack of peace? What will help you be more open to the gift of Christ's peace? How can you be an instrument of Christ's peace to others? How do you see Christ's presence and peace manifest in our congregation? How can we as a congregation carry out Jesus' mission to be peacemakers and break down walls of prejudice and fear?
