Questions for Reflection —

- Who are the "lepers" in our society, those avoided or rejected by others for moral or social reasons? Who are the social exiles in your workplace, school, or neighborhood? What does it look like for you to respect the dignity of every human being and to freely offer everyone God's love and compassion? Is there any discomfort in your doing so? What do you need in order to go beyond your comfort zone and reach out with compassion?
- Where/how have you seen Jesus breaking down social boundaries and cultural dividing walls between groups of people? What still-existing walls do you pray for Jesus to tear down in our world? What part can we as a congregation play in bringing people together across various differences? What does it mean for us to promote inclusivity and diversity within our community of faith? What does it look like for us to welcome the stranger and the outcast?
- What has been the rhythm of your spiritual life during these summer months? What helps you stay attentive to God's voice and alert to God's presence in your daily life? How do you keep God as the central focus of your life? What distractions impede that focus? What can you do during this season to help yourself slow down and pay attention to God?
