DID YOU KNOW?


We will be celebrating Wesley's annual Harvest service in a few more weeks on Sunday, September 29. Harvest celebrations of all kinds have been important throughout human history in many religious traditions. There are about one hundred references to harvest in the Bible, not surprising since agriculture has always been the basis of Palestine's economy. Although we no longer live in an agrarian society we certainly can still identify with the general principles that are important in the harvests of the Bible. Did you know that the three main festivals of the Old Testament were scheduled to coincide with various seasons of harvest? Passover occurred at the time of the barley harvest, Pentecost at the wheat harvest, and the Feast of Tabernacles (Feast of Booths) at the end of the year with the fruit harvest. Harvest is seen as an image of abundance as well as reward for labor. The various feasts and festivals are times of excitement, generosity, and joy.

Because of the importance of the harvest in the lives of the people, it also became an important source of imagery and symbolism for religious teaching; it is appropriate to reflect on the metaphorical images of the harvest in the Bible as we consider what it means to be stewards of God's gifts in our lives. In his teachings Jesus presented harvest as a time of opportunity in the present as well as eventually a time of final judgment.

As in Biblical times, our Harvest celebration relates to the central core of how we live out our faith within our believing community that is the fellowship of Wesley United Methodist Church. It is an opportunity for us to offer the fruit of our investment of our time, our efforts, and all of who we are to fulfill God's intended purposes for our church and our world.
