Eminent composer Emma Lou Diemer died this June 2 at age 96. She composed for many genres including choir, organ, piano, orchestra, etc. Her compositional style over the years has varied from tonal to atonal, from traditional to experimental. Dr. Diemer joined the faculty of the University of California (UCSB) in 1971 where she was professor emerita, from 1991 to 2024.

Carolyn Hamlin became organist at First Baptist Church of Easley, SC on July 7, 1958 and retired March 31 this Easter after serving 66 years in her beloved church. She is known and respected for her dedication to worship. She composes for organ and choir which are published by a variety of U.S. publishers. Dr. Hamlin has received the Order of the Silver Crescent, South Carolina's highest civilian honor.
