#### MUSIC NOTES: ATHALIE the Lord is exalted (postlude)

Elijah is modelled on the oratorios of two Baroque masters, Bach and Handel; however, in its lyricism and use of orchestral and choral color the style clearly reflects Mendelssohn's own skill as an early Romantic composer. Mendelssohn uses biblical episodes relating to Elijah, among the episodes is the resurrection of a dead youth. A dramatic episode is the contest of the gods, in which Jehovah consumes an offered sacrifice in a column of fire, while a sequence of increasingly frantic prayers by the prophets of the god Baal failed. Part I is concluded by the bringing of rain to parched Israel through Elijah's prayers. Part II depicts the persecution of Elijah by Queen Jezebel, his retirement to the desert, his vision of God appearing, his return to his work, and his ascension on a fiery chariot into heaven. The work ends with prophecies and praise.
