MUSIC NOTES

Yes, today's prelude and the postlude are the same music, Variations on SINE NOMINE by David Potts. SINE NOMINE, Latin for without name, following the Renaissance tradition of naming certain compositions "SINE NOMINE" if they were not settings for preexisting tunes. When a composer puts notes on a paper and does so following the rules of good music composition it then becomes the privilege of the performer to interpret the score.

As I read through the music and then played the music I heard two pieces of music; I heard the lyricism of the scales/runs and I also heard the drama of the chords and "walking bass". It then became my choice to determine if the composition was a prelude or a postlude and with the amazing Skinner organ that graces the Wesley United Methodist Church of Worcester, I was able to register (select stops) that interpreted the piece as either a prelude or postlude, so I chose to do both; illustrating the great versatility of the organ and the composition. Thank you, David Potts, for trusting me with interpreting your composition.

Originally there were eleven stanzas, this hymn is usually edited to six or fewer stanzas in most hymnals. Omitted stanzas include "For the Apostles' glorious company", "For the Evangelists", and "For Martyrs".

Ralph Vaughan Williams composed SINE NOMINE in 1906 and wrote two harmonizations—one for unison stanzas and one for choral stanzas. Many consider this tune to be among the finest of twentieth-century hymn tunes.
