Questions for Reflection —

What helps you to maintain your trust in God's ongoing generosity and presence with you no matter the external circumstances? How do you express your gratitude to God? How do you share your blessings with people you encounter at home, at work or school, at church, and/or in your local community?
- What are some of the essential truths which help you to align your life with Jesus? What do you do when those truths clash with secular values? What do you need in order to live by God's standards rather than conform to norms of society? How does your life testify to the eternal truths of Jesus' teachings?
