#### A God Moment from Kim (a friend of Debi Reynolds)

My daughter-in-law was napping at home with my grandson, almost 3. She woke up to thick smoke in the house, so badly that she could not see anything. They had just received an oil delivery that morning and that morning my son had just shown her where the shut-off valve was. She quickly grabbed my still sleeping grandson and ran downstairs, shut the valve off and ran outside.

Once outside, she saw a police officer talking to the next-door neighbors, porch combined. She noticed the road had already been blocked off and the firemen were there as well. The police officer put my DIL and grandson in the back of his car because she just had shorts on - no coat or shoes. The firemen were able to get their dog and put it in the car with them and found their cat and was able to put it in the dog crate in the home for the time being.

Turns out, there was a fire still within their heater. Thankfully, because of a passerby, it did not spread further. By the time I got there, the front door was open, and they were airing out the house.

She learned that someone had been driving by, saw the smoke from the chimney and thought that it was not your normal chimney smoke, so had called 911.

I truly believe it was a higher power that they were lucky that things happened the way they did and how everything is coming together for them so far. There was another home just days before that did not fare as well. I believe it was destroyed by the fire, no lives lost thankfully. I know they just had their heater serviced about three weeks prior, but I am not sure if their chimney was cleaned.

<u>Safety Note</u>: Perhaps this story made you think about reviewing where the oil shut-off valve is with the adults and teens in your house. Some houses have a safety switch in another part of the house too.

If you have gas heat instead of oil, the shut-off switch is on the furnace, at least in the newer models. Since the gas furnace is probably in the cellar, you don't want to go there. Instead, if you smell gas get everyone and your pets out of the house immediately and Call 911.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

As we come to the close of the season of Ordinary Time following Epiphany we will observe Transfiguration Sunday on March 2, as a transition into the season of Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on March 5. During this Lectionary Year C we will hear the story from the Gospel of Luke, but each of the synoptic Gospels records this event in Jesus' life in which his appearance became radiantly transformed in the presence of three of his disciples on a mountaintop with the appearance of Moses and Elijah, and an audible voice from heaven.


Although this particular event is commemorated and celebrated at different times by various traditions within the Christian Church, the Protestant tradition observes Transfiguration on the Sunday prior to Lent for the theological role the Transfiguration plays in the overall calendar of the liturgical year. In the Transfiguration we see a fuller expression of the deity of Christ and the glory he has with God. The presence of Moses and Elijah is usually interpreted as an indication that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). In the context of the Bible, the story of the Transfiguration is told as a bridge between Jesus' public ministry and his Passion. Similarly for us as we hear this story just before the start of Lent, we are reminded that the same Jesus who is manifested as the Savior of the World at Christmas/Epiphany is the same Jesus who after the pilgrimage of Lent will also be manifested as Savior of the World at the Easter celebration of his Resurrection.

The word *glory*, which appears hundreds of times in the Bible, plays a prominent role in hymns and liturgies Transfiguration Sunday. One of the main Hebrew words which is translated as glory means "weight" or "importance", but glory also refers to concepts of splendor and magnificence. It is a word which in the Old Testament is applied to the places where God is worshiped as well as to God, especially in God's visible manifestations to humans, as in God's encounters with Moses on Mt. Sinai and in the visions of the prophets Isaiah and Ezekiel. In the New Testament glory pervades the story of Jesus from his birth to the transfiguration to his resurrection and ascension, as well as to the future images of the second coming of Christ

Ascribing glory is a key component of the worship of God; thus it is not surprising that the word *glory* appears more than 50 times in the book of Psalms alone. During Sunday morning worship at the time of the presentation of our tithes and offerings we usually sing a "Doxology". The word *doxology* itself translates from the Greek as "words of glory." Doxological verses of praise and blessing are found at the close of each of the five sections of the book of Psalms, which is essentially the ancient Hebrew hymnal. In the Christian tradition, doxological texts usually also include a trinitarian reference to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What all of these doxologies have in common is that they express one of the main purposes for and meaning of worship itself—the acknowledgment and celebration of the Glory of God. As we continue to ponder our mission and ministry as individuals and as a congregation, how appropriate it is that the words engraved over the front entrance to our church building are "To the Glory of God and the service of man."
