Questions for Reflection —

What helps you to hear the voice of Jesus calling you back?
- Who ae the people who might feel excluded from or rejected by organized religion or the institutional church? What does it mean for us as a congregation to do the work of seeking and finding those who are alienated from the church for whatever reason? How can we as a congregation participate in God's mission of reconciliation and restoration for the "lost"? What does welcome and hospitality look like towards people who consider themselves outsiders?
- Who do you know that needs to be gone after, searched for? Who in your workplace or neighborhood might feel left behind or overlooked? What would it mean for you personally to actively build relationships with them? Who are the people that are presently undervalued or devalued in our society? What are the societal situations in need of love, faith, and hope? What are some ways we as a congregation might take action to challenge societal norms that degrade and devalue the humanity of others? What action(s) might we take to address the needs of and protect the vulnerable?

O Lord, open my eyes that I may see the needs of others; open my ears that I may hear their cries; open my heart so that they need not be without succor; let me not be afraid to defend the weak because of the anger of the strong, nor afraid to defend the poor because of the anger of the rich.
